1.1 Features

Generates awesome codenames :)

1.2 Quickstart

You can use the `generate_codename()` function and pick your favorite:

```
>>> from awesome_codename import generate_codename
>>> generate_codename()
'abnormal keeper'
>>> generate_codename()
'altruistic supermodel'
>>> generate_codename()
'recovered image'
```

Or run `awesome-codename` from the command line:

```
$ awesome-codename 3
square thermometer
best shaker
countywide fusion
```

Installation

2.1 Stable release

To install Awesome Codename, run this command in your terminal:

```
$ pip install awesome-codename
```

If you don't have `pip` installed, this [Python installation guide](#) can guide you through the process.

2.2 From sources

The sources for Awesome Codename can be downloaded from the [Github repo](#).

You can either clone the public repository:

```
$ git clone git://github.com/rolando/awesome-codename
```

Or download the [tarball](#):

```
$ curl -OL https://github.com/rolando/awesome-codename/tarball/master
```

Once you have a copy of the source, you can install it with:

```
$ pip install -e .
```
